### Information for Authors

This journal is particularly interested in articles that focus on issues encountered by practicing professionals, especially articles that draw on or explore the similarities and differences between the ethical issues that arise in two or more professions. Unsolicited book reviews and information of professional interest will also be included as space permits.

Authors may submit digitized versions of their papers in Wordperfect or Word format as an attachment to an email addressed to [rbaum@ufl.edu](mailto:rbaum@ufl.edu). Alternatively, they may mail three (3) hard copies of their manuscripts to Professional Ethics Journal, Box 15017, Gainesville, FL 32604. In their cover letter, authors should certify that the manuscript is not currently under consideration by any other journal.

Since a blind review process is used, the author's name should not appear on the manuscript. Because of the broadly inter-disciplinary nature of this journal, no single style (such as APA, MLA, University of Chicago) is required for all manuscripts; authors are free to use whatever style they deem to be appropriate for their work, with the one exception that notes not embedded in the text should be numbered consecutively at the end of the paper rather than at the bottom of the page to which they refer. Authors are encouraged to use non-sexist language.

Every effort will be made to notify authors of the status of their manuscripts within four months of the date of submission.
