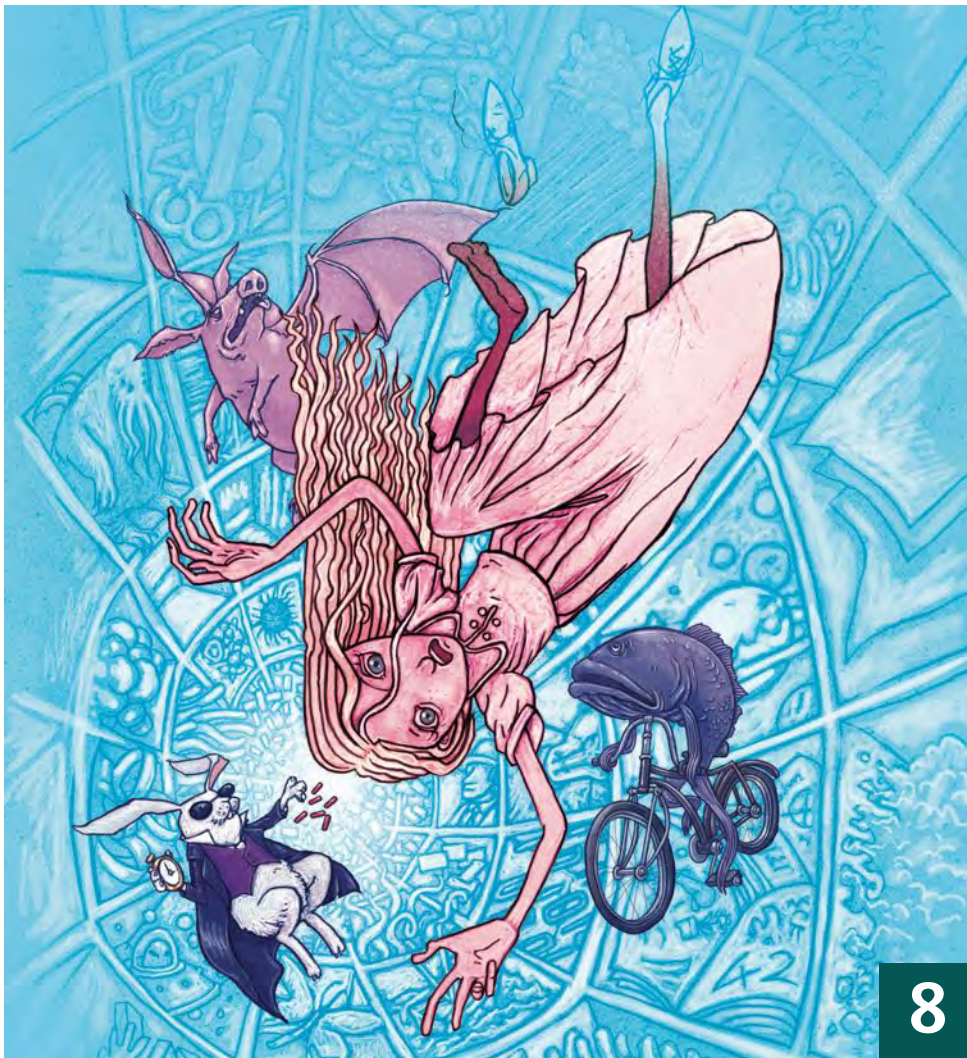

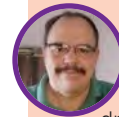
### Eleni Angelou

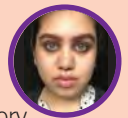
### Paul Griffiths
