Information for Authors

This journal is particularly interested in articles that focus on issues encountered by practicing professionals, particularly articles that draw on or explore the similarities and differences between the ethical issues that arise in two or more professions. Unsolicited book reviews and information of professional interest will also be included as space permits.

Authors should submit three (3) copies of their manuscripts. Since a blind review process will be used, the author's name should not appear on the manuscript. Because of the broadly interdisciplinary nature of this journal, no single style (such as APA, MLA, University of Chicago) is required for all manuscripts; authors are free to use whatever style they deem to be appropriate for their work, with the one exception that notes not embedded in the text should be numbered consecutively at the end of the paper rather than at the bottom of the page to which they refer. Authors are encouraged to use non-sexist language.

Every effort will be made to notify authors of the status of their manuscripts within three months of the date of submission.

Authors retain the copyright on their work; persons wishing to reprint a particular essay must obtain permission directly from the author.
